
Garden Flowers






Sunny golden Daffodils brighten fresh green spring fields and make beautiful bouquets.




A cheerful favorite in garden, flower pot or window box is the bright red Geranium.




Flowering Dogwood, with its showy pinkish white bracts that look like petals, adds color to parks and lawns.




Graceful, nodding yellow Canada Lilies brighten a summer meadow.




With its giant size and rich colors the Oriental Poppy easily attracts attention. Its center is maroon and the petals may be vibrant orange-red, deep red or pink.




The showy Zinnia is a sturdy flower whose reds, oranges, golds and yellows brighten summer and autumn gardens.

A tiny Hummingbird, whose rapidly beating wings make a humming sound, hovers ready to sip from a beautiful blue Morning-glory.




Pink, yellow, white, salmon, red-the many varieties of the Rose add enchantment to the gardens of many flower lovers.
