

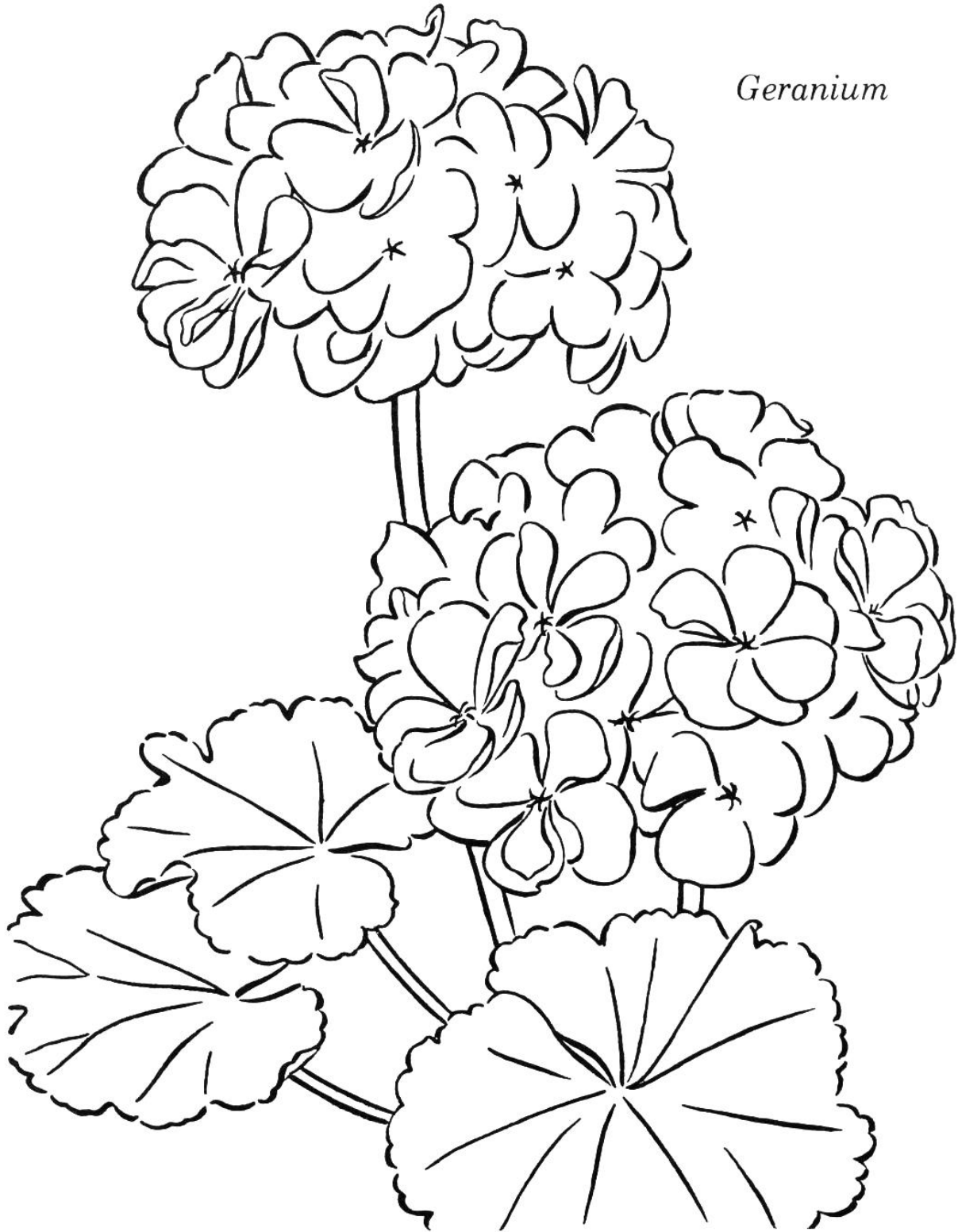
# Garden Flowers

*Pink Flowering Dogwood*

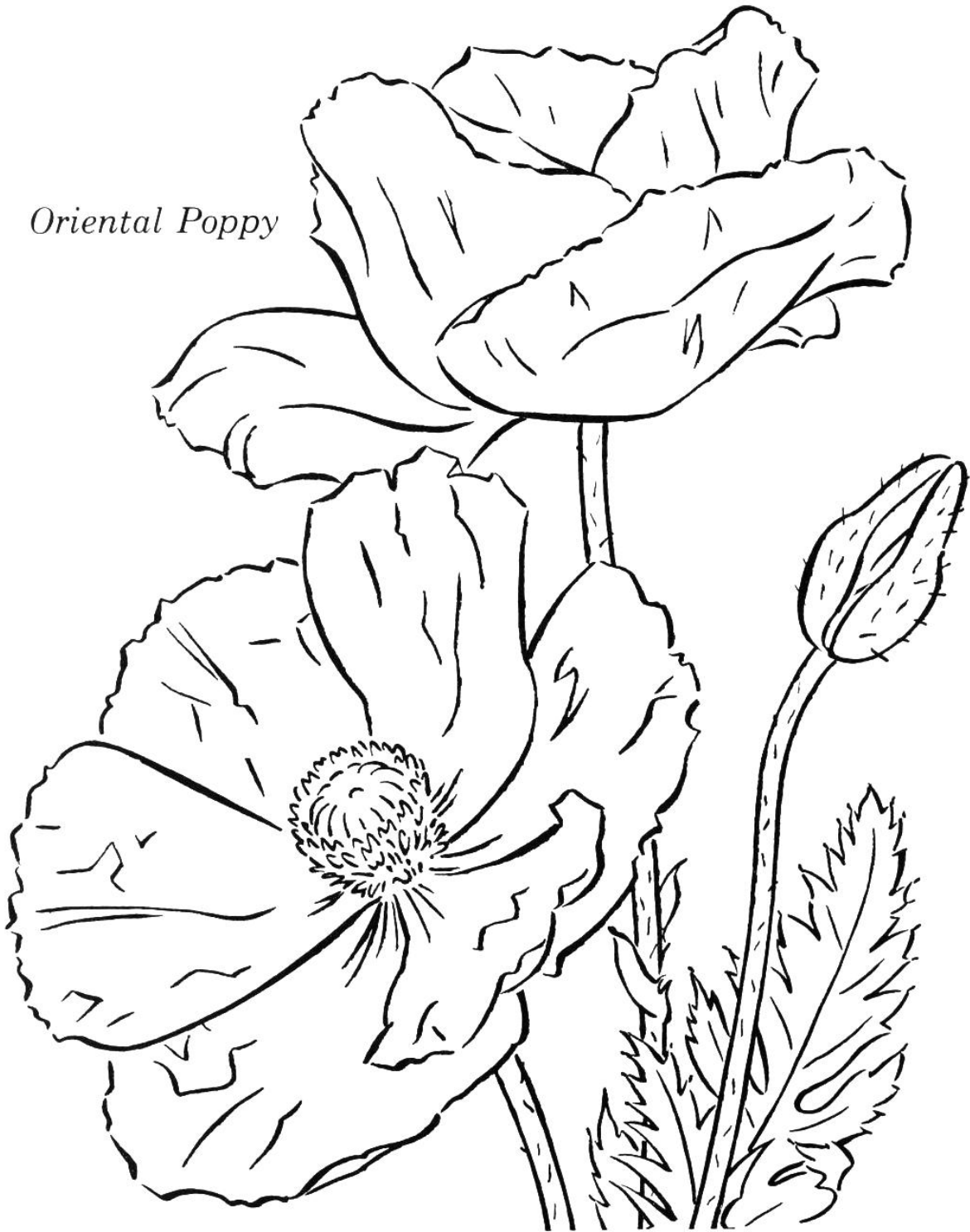
Flowering Dogwood, with its showy pinkish white bracts that look like petals, adds color to parks and lawns.

*Canada Lily*



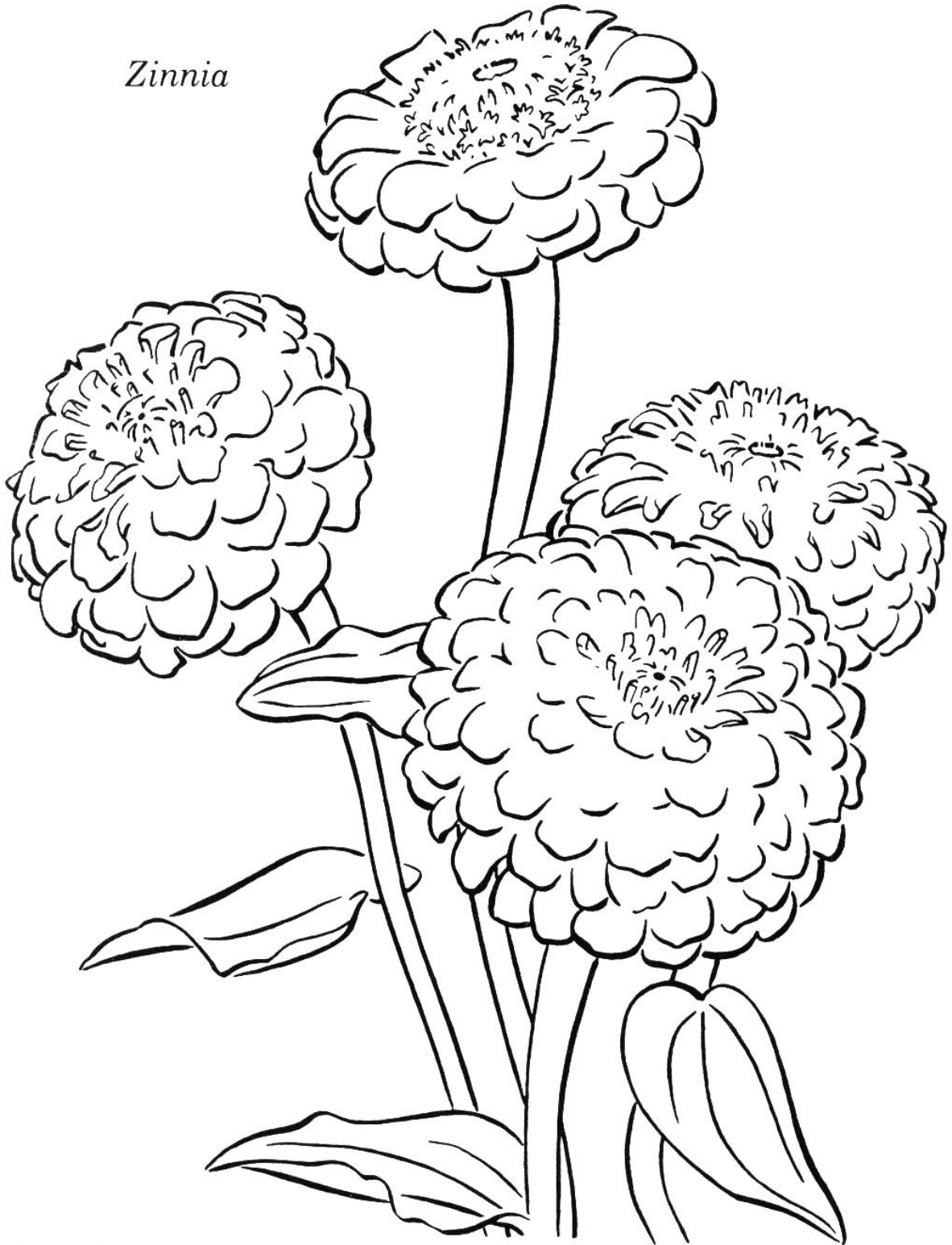
Graceful, nodding yellow Canada Lilies brighten a summer meadow.

*Oriental Poppy*



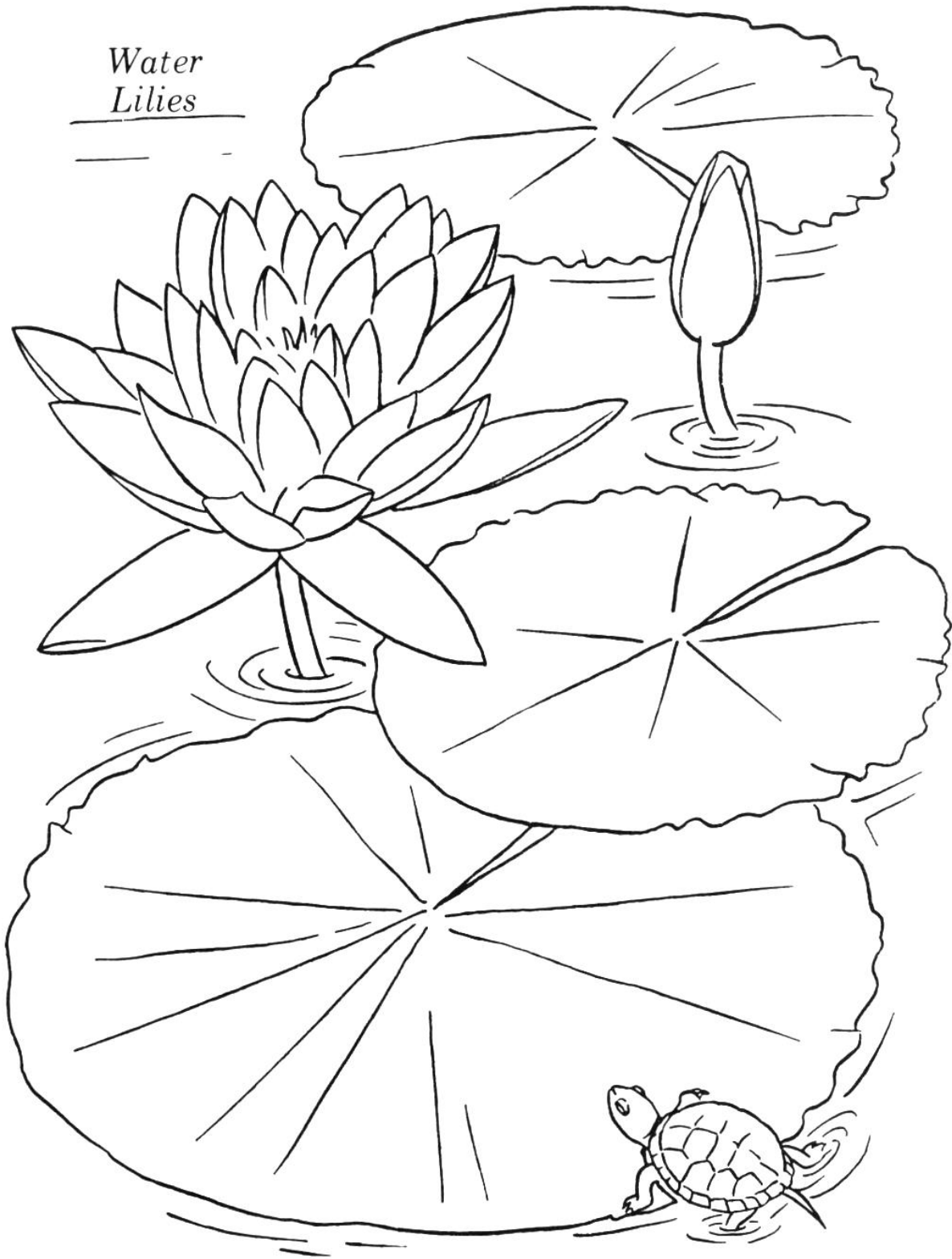
With its giant size and rich colors the Oriental Poppy easily attracts attention. Its center is maroon and the petals may be vibrant orange-red, deep red or pink.

*Zinnia*



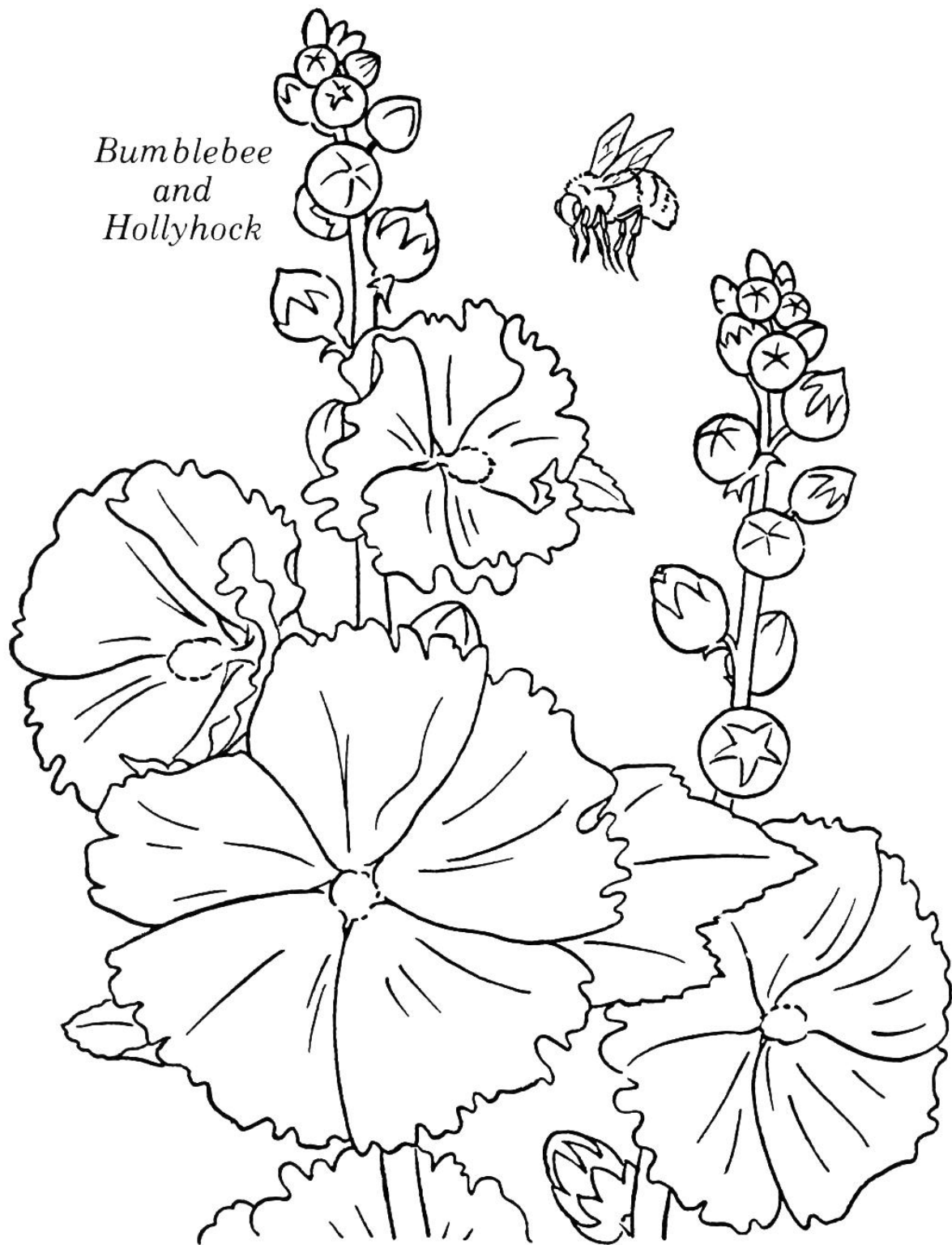
The showy Zinnia is a sturdy flower whose reds, oranges, golds and yellows brighten summer and autumn gardens.

Water Lilies decorate a garden pool. Some are yellow; some are pink; some are white.

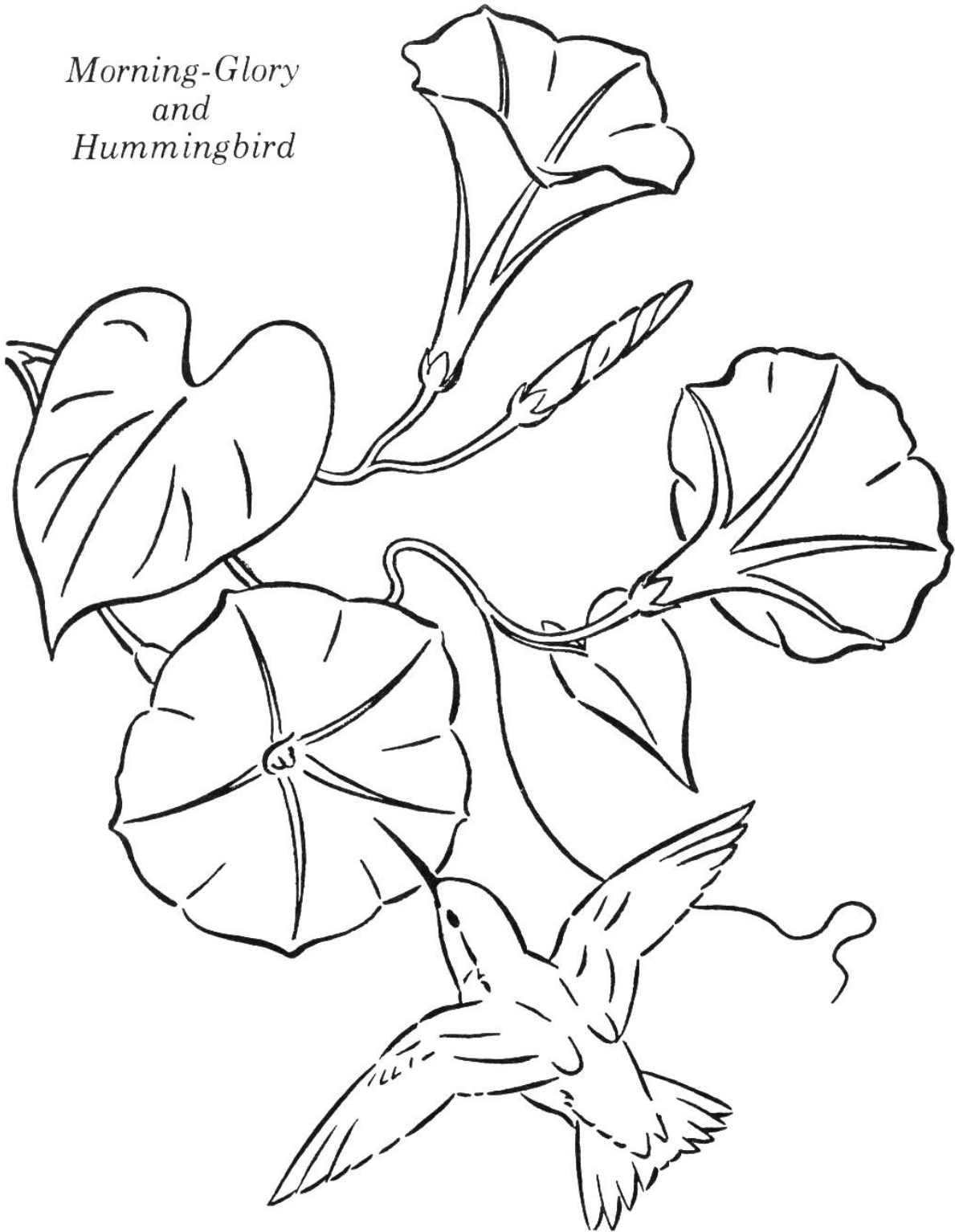




*Bumblebee

*Iris*

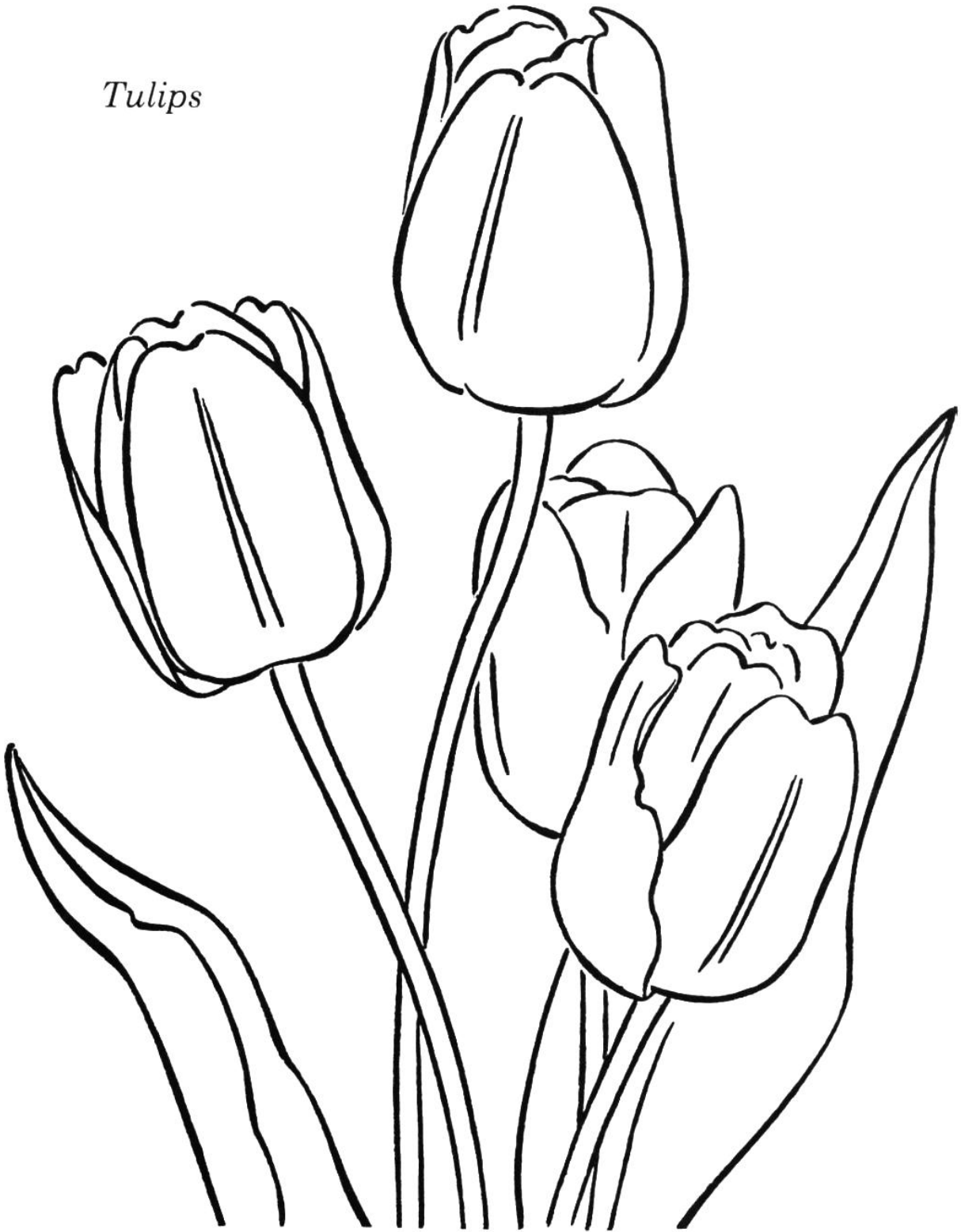
The large handsome flower of the Iris comes in many shades of purple and lavender, and in yellow or white.
